PARISH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM (PREP): Parents are offered support in the faith formation of their child(ren) on Sundays from 10:15 am until 11:30 am in the Saint Anthony School Campus. These sessions are age appropriate with activities and lessons that build on the faith formation that is ongoing in the home.

Sacrament Preparation for a child(ren): Preparation for a child to receive the Sacrament of Baptism is facilitated through the Parish Office (954-463-4614). There are details that affect the ability to arrange and secure a date for the celebration that must be completed prior to the Baptism.

Preparation for a child to receive the Sacraments of First Reconciliation (confession), First Eucharist (Holy Communion), and or Confirmation involve a minimum of two full years of faith formation. Attendance and participation during these years is essential. This process is facilitated through the Parish Religious Education Office.
